Notes/Comments:

- (1) The Student Success Course Requirement is satisfied by successfully completing EDUC 1301 Introduction to the Teaching Profession.
- (2) Student must complete MATH 1314, MATH 1350 and MATH 1351 with a grade of "C" or better to receive transfer credit for MATH 3381. If ALL three MATH courses are NOT completed with a grade of "C" or better, the student will be REQUIRED to complete MATH 3381 at SHSU.
- (3) Core - Life & Physical Sciences [30]: BIOL1406 - Biology I for Science Majors or BIOL1408 - Biology I for Non-science Majors, CHEM1405 - Introduction to Chemistry, PHYS1410 - Elementary Physics, or GEOL1403 - Physical Geology.
- (4) If completed at LSC with a grade of "C" or better, HIST 2301 will replace HIST 3398 at SHSU.
- (5) Core - Social/Behavioral Sciences [80] recommend courses: PSYC 2301 - General Psychology, GEOG 1303 - World Regional Geography, ECON 2301- Macro- economics, or TECA 1354 - Child Growth & Development.

Program Specific Information:

Bachelor of Science in Education (EC-6 Bilingual Core)

- Student must make a "C" or better in all courses required in the EC-6 Bilingual Core degree program at SHSU, including courses transferred from LSC or other institution.
- Prior to transfer, the student should be proficient in reading, writing, and listening in the Spanish language. If not, additional coursework may be required.

Program Admissions Requirements:

- Student must have a cumulative 2.75 GPA; grade replacement is acceptable and student can retake classes at SHSU or LSC to replace grades (higher grade will replace lower grade). Be careful about retaking courses more than once; if you exceed 30 hours over degree plan requirements, you will pay out-of-state tuition for the remainder of classes to complete degree. All attempted college hours are calculated, including withdrawals and initial attempts of a class

- Transfer Honors students admitted to SHSU:
 - will be accepted to SHSU's Honors College. Students must have a minimum GPA of 3.25 and satisfy other Honors College admission criteria (such as full-time enrollment of at least 12 hours)
 - may transfer up to 12 hours of transfer Honors credits
 - will be eligible for additional scholarships
 - may develop their transfer Honors thesis (if completed) into an SHSU Honors thesis (and thereby graduate "with Highest Honors")
 - will be eligible, if space permits, to live in SHSU's dorms
