The facilitator plays four key roles.

- 2. **Mentor**: facilitate asynchronous and synchronous, in-person and virtual discussions of module content and Course progress.
- 3. Monitor: track Course-taker participation and offer encouragement.
- 4. Liaison: with ACUE representatives and the TLC staff.

Qualifications: Ideal candidates will demonstrate the following characteristics:

- Prior completion of ACUE's Effective Teaching Practices course
- Expertise in effective college instructional strategies
- Outstanding written communication skills
- Ongoing interest in furthering higher education instructors' personal professional development
- Demonstrated welcoming instincts, a personable and social approach, and the ability to effectively handle conflicts
- Preferred: experience facilitating teaching-related professional development workshops

Compensation: A \$2000 stipend will be awarded in June 2026
