Identifying Essential Leadership Qualities for Career and Technical Education and Special Education Leaders

This study explores key leadership qualities essential for effective collaboration between CTE and special education leaders. Using a multiple case study approach, interviews revealed that communication, flexibility, and trust are critical for building strong partnerships. Leaders who emphasize open communication, adaptability, and mutual accountability are more successful in fostering collaboration and addressing the diverse needs of students with disabilities. The findings suggest that targeted leadership training and joint professional development can improve interdisciplinary collaboration, leading to more inclusive and supportive environments for students with disabilities in CTE programs.
